The New Mexico Native American Indian Nurses Association is a non-profit organization that embodies stewardship, building community and nurse excellence through mentorship and scholarship opportunities. We are a group of dedicated nursing professionals and educators aimed in supporting and empowering the American Indian community. We welcome student membership; however, membership is not required to apply.

Eligibility: Open to all Native American Nursing students currently registered with a federally recognized tribe. In good academic standing, currently residing in the state of New Mexico and attending an accredited Nursing Program in NM.

Award information: Limited All awarded recipients will receive \$2500 per scholarship. Funds may be applied toward any expense that supports the student's nursing education endeavor as determined by the student.

Applications must include the following:

- (1) This completed application form
- (2) Proof of federally recognized tribal affiliation or Certificate of Indian Blood
- (3) A recent photograph of yourself and a 75-word bio stating who you are, where you are from, and what your personal goal is and why?
- (3) Typed personal response [Limit to no more than 2 pages]. Please answer the following:
How will the NMNAINA student success award help your educational endeavor?
What impact do you hope to make in your native community?
Discuss any professional, community service, or student nurse association activity involvement. Indicate awards, accomplishments, research or volunteer projects you have engaged in.
- (4) Letter of Recommendation
Letter of recommendation from current Nursing School Faculty or Nursing Advisor on official letterhead. No more than one faculty recommendation please.
